FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN:

I write you, supposedly, from Mexico. We had a good flight and a warm welcome in Puerto Escondido. We spent the first night in and came into Puerto Escondido Tuesday. We stay in hotels, but the people take great delight in feeding us. The poverty here does not dim the people's generosity. If tithing means giving ten percent of one's wealth and income, then the people here tithe three or four times more than the basic tithe. They have little in material wealth, but a vast supply of Christian wealth, which they share by their abundant hospitality. Poor in wealth, they enrich with their faith and love for God and others.

They have people coming up from Guatemala making for the United States who travel through their lands. They help provide food and shelter for them on their journey despite the fact that the government actively discourages them.

LITURGY:

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This marks the end of the Christmas season and the start of what we call Ordinary Time. This year, we have nine Sundays in this period before we start Lent. Lent comes the second latest date it possibly can this year; it can come no later than April 25. This year, when Christmas comes on a Sunday, the pastor's birthday, which always comes on the same day of the week as Christmas, will come on Easter.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS:

When school closes because of weather, except for fog, we cancel CCD and all meetings except Mass and the sacrament of penance. If we have bad weather after school hours, we leave it to you parents to make the decision about whether to bring your children or not.

FIRST PENANCE:

Our second graders will take part in a workshop on the sacrament of penance with their parents next Saturday, January 15 from 8:45 to 1:00. The workshop will close with the sacrament of penance and lunch. We shall have several priests to help us with the sacrament; we can accommodate the whole family.

ST. ANN SODALITY MEETING AND DINNER


