FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN:

We have a shortage of priests, here and in many places throughout the world. Bishop Carmona needs priests in his missionary diocese. Bishop Carmona invited us to an ordination in his diocese last week. He ordained a young man from his diocese, a man of ancient indigenous stock, to serve as a missionary of St Charles-Scalabrinians in Indonesia. I noted the bishop's great joy in ordaining someone from his missionary diocese to serve in another missionary place. It spoke to me of how God enriches us with his poverty.

The bishop had the ordination in this man's parish, an hour away from Puerto Escondido. He had it outside under a tent that housed three thousand people. The bishop spoke of us during his homily, explaining how we had come, not as tourists, but at his invitation, to witness to our common faith. The man's family gave each priest a stole, a corporal and a purificator as a remembrance of the event.

Everywhere we went, we saw the immense faith of the people. The people we visited had never seen a Catholic from the U. S. A. They had seen Protestants, but not Catholics.

LITURGY:

The homilies for the next two months will focus on the liturgy. I find it hard to preach homilies, not based on the Scripture texts of the day. Nonetheless, the Church allows the priest to give homilies on the rites and prayers of the Mass. After the introductory rites, we come to the Liturgy of the Word, the first major part of the Mass. The Introductory Rites have great importance, and no one should skip them because they prepare us to hear the word of God and celebrate the Eucharist. Topics will include the format of the Lectionary, the selection of passages, the cycles in the readings and the characteristics of the readings before the Gospel.
