FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN:

My sisters never cease to amaze me. My brothers would, but they have less chance. My favorite sister Ann reads avidly on a variety of topics and keeps me supplied with books. I wore my cape to her house last week, and this reminded her of her cape from nurses training. She had a warm wool cape, grey with red lining, which formed part of their school uniform. She sometimes wishes that she still had it.

We talked about Eleanor of Aquitaine, ants and the production of wheat, the genealogy of the Vincent family and the latest news. I think she could write a doctoral thesis with the knowledge she has. I have known her part of my life, but she has known me longer: all her life. Amazing.

LITURGY: THE READINGS

Each reading proclaimed at Mass has three distinct parts. The title gives the source of the reading. The word, "The word of the Lord" signals the close of the reading. The reading comes between the title and the cue. We should hear distinct pauses between the title and the start of the reading and between the reading and the cue for its ending.

Without the pauses, the ear may have difficulty adjusting well to the start of the reading and the words, "The word of the Lord" may seem like the end of the last sentence of the reading.

We who proclaim the readings should proceed something like this:

"A reading from the book of Isaiah." Pause. "In the year King Uzziah . . . [reading]. Without a sufficient pause between the reading and the cue, it would seem to say, "Send me the word of the Lord" instead of "Send me (on the errand)."

When I went to school, long before the invention of horses, we used to diagram sentences, separating the subject from predicate, verb from direct object, modifiers with the words they modify. The diagram always put a pause mark between the subject and the predicate. This indicates that we can take a pause, have a brief silence, between the subject of a sentence and the rest of the sentence. This can help both lector and listener understand better, how the thought in each sentence hangs together. This can help us understand better the word of God that the reading declares in our midst.

LIFE AFTER DIVORCE


