FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

Why do we have such a late Easter this year? Agriculture plays a factor in determining the date of Easter. Easter always comes on a Sunday, the first Sunday after the first full moon after the start of spring. Easter can come as early as March 22 (unknown) and as late as April 25 (1943 and 2038). We should relate to this well because of our farming culture: the cycles of nature determine the date of Easter.

EASTER TRIDUUM COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

Those over 14: Abstinence from meat on Good Friday by precept and, by recommendation, on Holy Saturday.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59: Fast on Good Friday by precept and, by recommendation, on Holy Saturday. Fasting means less than two full meals a day.
