Lent ought to challenge us. It challenges us to prepare for baptism and renewal of baptism. In what way do the two chosen for baptism at the Easter Vigil, whom we now call the Elect, challenge us? How do they give us example of how we ought to live Lent? Weekly, both Jenny and Jessica meet with us to study the sacred scriptures and to learn more about the Church. Each day, what do we do with the sacred scriptures and the call of Christ to penance? We should find ourselves encouraged by Jessica and Jenny, one a teenager and the other a young mother. If you see either of them, greet her pleasantly for they walk the same path we do towards Easter and the Lord.

Every Sunday, even the six during Lent celebrates the resurrection of the Lord Jesus and we very appropriately use the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary.

EASTER TRIDUUM COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

Those over 14: Abstinence from meat on Good Friday by precept and, by recommendation, on Holy Saturday.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59: Fast on Good Friday by precept and, by recommendation, on Holy Saturday. Fasting means less than two full meals a day.
