LITURGY: EASTER

Welcome to Easter. This year Easter ends on June12, so if you plan to do something "after Easter," you have fifty days to wait. In 1943, Easter started on April 25, the latest date possible for it.

During Easter, we celebrate baptism. We congratulate Jessica Groff and Jenni Neiberg on their baptism into Christ's risen body and, hence, into full communion with the Church.

The Church considers the weeks of Easter as one big celebration of the Paschal event. Both the beginning of Easter and its climax celebrate essentially the same event, the glorification of the Lord Jesus by his resurrection and the giving of the Holy Spirit. We refer to the Sundays of Easter as the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth (Ascension) and Pentecost.
