FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

Thanks to all who worked hard to make the confirmation ceremony go off so well. While God sent his Spirit upon our ninth graders, their parents, Linda Meyer, Mike Meyer and their teams put much good human effort into the preparation of the students. To all of these, I give thanks.

We have three seminarians from our two parishes. I cannot take credit for them. My ancestors in the priesthood, men such as Father Leo Hoying and Father Edwin Francis did much in their day to foster vocations. I thank God for men like these, and in a special way, I thank God for Father Hoying who died last Sunday morning.

LITURGY: ASCENSION OF THE LORD

People have said, "I'll get around to it when Ascension Thursday comes on Sunday." If you have ever thought this, the time has come to do it because the Feast of the Ascension now comes on Sunday. Our bishops have received permission to celebrate the feast on Sunday for several reasons. The pace of life and the demands of works in the United States often made it hard or nearly impossible for people to celebrate the feast on Thursday. Many, no matter how hard they tried, often forgot the feast day because it came in the middle of the week. In similar fashion, some came to the 8:00 non-Mass last Sunday because they usually do. To give the feast the celebration it deserves, our bishops had it moved to the seventh Sunday of Easter. So we celebrate the Ascension next Sunday, not this coming Thursday.

REST IN PEACE

Father Leo A. Hoying, twenty-seventh pastor of Holy Family and thirty-seventh pastor of St Denis, died last Sunday morning at 2:30. He spent many years ministering to our people in the northern area of the archdiocese. We had his funeral on Thursday at St Augustine Church. The fact that so many of you came for the funeral shows how much you esteemed him and his ministry here in Versailles.

Margaret Streib, our oldest parishioner at age 99, died on May 8 and received Christian burial on May 12. Please remember Margaret and Fr. Hoying and their families in your prayers.
