FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

I have accepted the challenge, now I want to challenge the lectors and the congregation in general. I challenge the lectors to proclaim the first reading in such a way that we all remember it for the homily. I challenge them to proclaim it well so that people will gladly put the books down and listen to the readings as they should. This will make homilies on the first reading easier to deliver.

In the next week or so, we shall give each distributor and server a copy of the DVD, since we also copied on the DVD the work Joe Gehret did for his Eagle Project, "How to Serve Mass." LITURGY: THE POPHET ISAIAH

Meet the prophet Isaiah. Perhaps you should meet the two or three Isaiahs of the book of the prophet Isaiah. We seem to have two or three of them. Isaiah probably had a school of disciples who kept his work alive for several centuries. Isaiah himself (chapters 1-39) lived in the time of the kings, proximately 750-705 B.C. The rest of the prophecy of Isaiah (chapters 40-59 and 60-66) came after the last years of the exile (about 550 B.C.) to the early years of the return (537 B.C.).

The inspired book of Isaiah the Prophet includes the work of all those prophets who contributed to the sixty-six chapters of the book. The inspiration of God's Spirit guided the entire production of the book. We shall proclaim the first reading next Sunday from Isaiah 55:10-11, a passage that describes the power of God's rain and the power of his word.


REST IN PEACE
