FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

Thank you for praying for my brother Ed. He has returned home and seems to have no lasting effects from his stroke.

Three weeks ago, I spent 23 hours overnight in the hospital. My pulse had dropped well below normal for a reason nobody has explained. Since then I have monitored my pulse and it usually varies in a normal range. My doctor wants a clinical diagnosis of the problem, so he has remanded me to a cardiologist. I shall attend to this Tuesday afternoon.

LITURGY: MORE FROM KINGS

In the middle of the two books of Kings nestle the stories of the prophet Elijah and his protégé, Elisha. The two names sound exactly alike except for the j and sh: the vowels sounds do not change (ee-LI-zuh and ee-LI-shuh).

The prophet Elijah had just executed 450 prophets of the pagan god Baal. The queen then threatened his life and Elijah fled. He left Israel, crossed the desert to the mountain where Moses had met God. There he complained to God about his troubles and, in effect, resigned his commission as prophet of God. God, however, revealed himself in a mysterious way to Elijah and called him back to his vocation.
