FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

Next Friday, we shall join other pilgrims in Santiago de Compostela to walk part of the Camino de Santiago and experience other Catholic events in Santiago.

LITURGY: MORE FROM ISAIAH

Next week's first reading comes from the third major section of the prophet Isaiah. The scene has shifted from the age of the kings, beyond the Exile to the return to Jerusalem from exile.

The leaders at the time of the return from exile rejected all offers for help from outsiders. They wanted the exiles to have nothing to do with pagans or non-Israelite people. The books of Ezra and Nehemiah project this view.

The book of Ruth and this third section of Isaiah project a contrary view. Ruth shows how the Moabite, non-Israelite woman gave birth to the grandfather of King David. The third part of the prophecy of Isaiah starts and ends with an invitation to the Gentiles to join the Israelites (Isaiah 56:6-7; 66:18-24).
