FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

The first leg of our trip to World Youth Day started in the Archdiocese of Santiago de Compostela on the northwest corner of Spain. Spain traces its apostolic roots to the Apostle James. According to legend, he came to Spain after the ascension of the Lord and died in Santiago, a city named after him. The name Santiago means St Jacob, the Latin form of St James. J and I often interchange themselves in Latin texts; C and G come from the same family of consonants, the gutturals, which also include K, X, GH and CH (pronounced K). Here at the roots of Catholic faith in Spain, we chose to start the preliminary Days in the Dioceses.

We have stayed in a parish named after St Stephen in Noalla, several miles south of Santiago. Tomorrow, after Mass honoring the Assumption of Mary, we shall head for Fatima in Portugal. On Thursday, we shall head into Spain once again, for Madrid and Mass with the Pope. More next week.

LITURGY: KEY TO THE HOUSE OF DAVID

We meet the first Isaiah next week. A high government official, someone like a secretary of state or a chief of staff, has deserved a demotion. The demotion comes as a word from the Lord who will divest Shebna of his key and authority. God will transfer the office to Eliakim. All the symbolism of keys and insignia of authority come into play here.

Archaeologists have found an inscription on a seal dating back to time of King Hezekiah that reads, "Belonging to Shebna, son of SHR"

If we read this into the gospel account of Peter and the keys, then we can see the Lord investing Peter with the office of secretary of state and chief of staff to the Lord.


