#### **FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN**

We arrived in Madrid Friday, in time for the Way of the Cross through Madrid. Yesterday, we woke up early to get to a sports arena for Mass with all the pilgrims from the U.S. Afterwards we set out our pilgrimage walk.

The full walk took two and half hours and covered a distance of eight kilometers (5 miles). It went primarily through parks and tree-lined streets. Public transportation intersected the line at two points between the start and the finish at Quatro Veintes (Four Winds) Air Base. Some opted to start the trek from the middle or from the last quarter.

Three of our young women spent last night at the Vigil with the Pope in a special area close to him. The rest of us spent the vigil in our camp site, quite a distance away. To help all people see the Papal Mass, World Youth Day erected many television monitors. I concelebrated with the Pope along with hundreds of bishops and priests. This gave me a place closer than the others, who participated at Mass at the campsite. Many of us brought communion to the outlying areas of the congregation.

After Mass, the Pope will soon announce where he will hold the next World Youth Day. I cannot tell you where because Mass has not ended yet. It will end about noon.

#### LITURGY: JEREMIAH

Many people like the prophet Jeremiah. He has no fear of telling the Lord off, as he does in the passage used next weekend (20:7-9). Jeremiah has a deep interior crisis. Every time he acts according to his vocation, he runs into trouble from the people. Every time he refuses to speak God's word, the word makes him bloated and compels him to speak. Jeremiah feels that the Lord has taken advantage of him.

Jeremiah's served as God's prophet during the last days of the Southern Kingdom, the Kingdom of Judah, during the last kings of the Davidic dynasty. In those days, he seemed to speak words of warning. He went into exile with the people. There he could speak words of consolation. God did not abandon his people in their time of sin: he sent them Jeremiah to warn them. God did not abandon his people in exile: He sent Jeremiah to nurture them with God's word.
