NEW LITURGICAL TEXTS AND MUSIC

Starting September 11, our Catholic bishops have authorized us to use the new music and translations for the Glory to God, the Holy, Holy and the Memorial Acclamations and the Lamb of God. This permission only applies to the singing of these. When we recite them, we have to use the current translations. We do not have to use the new music and translations until November 26. The musicians and I have discussed this. Currently we plan to start using the new translations on the first weekend of October, after Joe Grilliot's ordination to the priesthood.

To prepare for this, we need to rehearse, practice and familiarize everybody with the new words. We have decided take fifteen minutes before every weekend Mass to do this. We will start this in October. This means that those who lead the Rosary will have to finish the Rosary or stop with it incomplete, fifteen minutes before Mass starts. To do this, they shall have to start no later than a half hour before and lead only the Rosary with the possible addition of the Fatima prayer between decades.

FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

LITURGY: EZEKIEL

Ezekiel started his service during the last days of Jeremiah. Ezekiel exercises his service between the years of 593-568, mostly during the exile (586-538). He stresses God's lordship and holiness and our personal responsibility. He denounces bad morals and apathetic worship. He preaches repentance. He calls us to let God write his covenant on our hearts instead of on stone.

He uses the image of watchman in a tower. Before the days of airplanes and bombers, people built walls around their cities. They would put towers at strategic places to help protect their cities. Those in the towers had to keep their eyes open for trouble and report any sign of an enemy's approach. The success of defense often depended on the ability of the watchmen. The watchmen had to spread warnings of coming threats. The moral watchmen have to proclaim the word of repentance to the wicked and the word of warning to the good.

God appointed Ezekiel as watchman for the people. God appoints parents as watchmen for their families. He appoints bishops and priests for the good of his Church. God wants us to do the assignment he gives us.


