FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

At World Youth Day, we visited many cathedrals and churches. We stayed four nights at Noalla near Compostela, we celebrated Mass in the parish church and in an old church dedicated to Our Lady de la Lanzada. Practically every major town in which we stopped had a cathedral. We spent less than a day visiting things other than churches or chapels. We saw the well-preserved Roman ruins in Conimbriga in Portugal and the major buildings of Madrid. We also visited a foundry in Toledo famous for its swords and metalwork. We had Mass everyday. The nature of our trip and the sights we visited reminded us of the spiritual nature of our journey.

LITURGY: ISAIAH

Consider vast differences: the national debt versus own debts; the sweep of God's creative genius and the narrow confines of our own plans and ideas; God's universal forgiveness and our petty selfishness. The prophets before the Exile exhorted their people to turn back to God. During the Exile, when it seemed that God had turned his back on the people, the prophets reminded the people of God's care for them.

God has vastly different ways of doing things and planning things than we do. God thinks high thoughts, but we think low ones. God can forgive debts bigger than our national debt, but we have trouble forgiving people who owe us very little.

NEW ENGLISH TRANSLATION

The Archbishop has given us permission to start using the new translation when we sing the Glory to God, the Holy, Holy and the memorial Acclamations. We shall start using this from the first Sunday of October on. We shall go over some of the texts starting this Sunday. We need the rosary to end by fifteen minutes before Mass starts.


