On Monday, September 26, Father Joe will celebrate the usual 8:00 Mass, but at Holy Family, his home altar. You may come to this Mass also.

FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

Christ came to save all people. He took on our human nature to do this. In the Creed we make this profession of faith, that "for us men . . . he became man." Both Greek and Latin have distinct words for man, the male member of the human race, and man the generic term for any member of the human race. French, Spanish, Portuguese and English do not have two specific terms. We must use man/men for the male and the generic term. Woman, man, person and human being all have plural forms.

People, however, does not have a singular form. for only one member of the people. We cannot use person as its singular form in the Creed because the Son of God did not become a human person: the person of the Son of God took on human nature, not human personhood, in the womb of his mother. The translators, then, had to translate "for us men (people), he became man (took on human nature).

LITURGY: EZEKIEL

We wrestled last week with forgiveness, while as a nation we mourned the tenth anniversary of a great evil that befell us. We have a call from God to forgive those who have done us wrong. Ezekiel confronts the problem from a different perspective. He notes how vastly God's way differs from ours. God created out of nothing, but we make things out of created matter. God forgives sins totally, but we struggle to do so partially. When sinners turn over a new leaf, God pardons them. When good people turns over a new leaf, God holds them responsible. God accepts the last decisions we make whereas we tend to judge by our standard that "our personal friends can do no wrong and personal enemies can do no right."

NEW ENGLISH TRANSLATION

The Archbishop has given us permission to start using the new translation when we sing the Glory to God, the Holy, Holy and the memorial Acclamations. We shall start doing this from the first Sunday of October on. We shall continue reviewing the new texts this Sunday fifteen minutes before Mass starts.
