LITURGY: ISAIAH

The Song of Songs speaks of vineyard and the beloved. Isaiah also sings of vineyard and the beloved. He speaks of the Lord and expresses a deep sense of betrayal, perhaps one that Isaiah also felt.

Beware songs. They can have turns and twists that come back on the hearer. The vine keeper spends hours on the vines. The farmer spends long hours with the crop. The potter spends long hours at the wheel. The carpenter spends long hours in the workshop. Parents spend long years raising their children. What happens when the grapes rot, the crop fails, the pottery breaks, the wood warps and the children turn away from their upbringing? The Lord looked for justice in us and what has he found? What ought we to do and what will the Lord God do?

NEW ENGLISH TRANSLATION

Next week, we start learning the new music for the new English translation. We have permission to use the music now, before the First Sunday of Advent. We shall learn first the music in the official book, a chanted version with simple but deep melodies. Later we shall learn more complex forms of the same texts. We shall rehearse in the fifteen minutes before Mass starts.
