The book has arrived! The new Roman Missal (Third Edition) came in Tuesday. It weighs almost 8 pounds and one ounce, about a pound and a half more than our current book and five pounds more than our smaller book. It has 178 more pages than the current edition. It seems to have a sturdy binding, one that I hope will last for many years. I like its arrangement of text. I see one drawback with it, that I may have to have the servers do weight training so that they can hold the book. In the other hand, why worry about a pound and a half?

I appreciate your cooperation in learning the new translations and music.

LITURGY: EXODUS, DEUTERONOMY AND LEVITICUS

In the Gospel, Jesus quotes from the books of Deuteronomy and Leviticus to teach the greatest commandments, love for God and love for neighbor.

The book of Exodus can serve as a commentary and a challenge to the teaching of Jesus. In Exodus, the Lord commands his people not to oppress the alien, the orphan, the widow, or the poor. Exodus challenges us to see in the immigrant from the south and the impoverished in our society as people deserving of respect and love.

If national governments and we believed in the Word of God, then our policies regarding immigration, finance and employment would drastically change. Perhaps the current crises in these areas have happened to call us away from greed and selfishness into true love and respect for our neighbor.
