FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

I spoke last week of the importance of music in the liturgy. I have attended three workshops for priests on the chants of the Mass. I have looked through the new *Roman Missal*.

The musical tones, or keys, join the Eucharistic Prayer and the Prayer over the Gifts and separate these from the other parts. The music also makes the Lord's Prayer and its doxology a unit. The other presidential prayers may have the same key as the Eucharistic Prayer or a different key.

The Amen to the Eucharistic Prayer has a very close tie to the doxology that precedes it ("Through him, with him"). While we have at times called it the Great Amen and while we may enhance it by repeating it, it seems best to leave it as a simple, but strong, response to the Eucharistic Prayer, Amen

LITURGY: WISDOM

The book of Wisdom does not appear in the Hebrew Bible. It probably came to us originally in Greek. It dates from the last half of the first century before Christ. The author, anonymous, probably lived in Alexandria Egypt. The author writes to strengthen the faith of his people living in the midst of pagans. He wants to show the wisdom of faith in the true God.

The author of the book of Wisdom personifies wisdom as a young lady, perhaps a queen. As such, wisdom resembles the virgins in the gospel passage.
