2011 OCTOBER COUNT

The October count for St. Denis for the five Sundays in October was 1639 for 5:00 p.m., 1095 for the 8:00 a.m. and 1948 for the 11:00 a.m. Mass, for an average weekend attendance of 936. Holy Family had a total count of 913 for the five Sundays, for an average attendance of 183 at the 9:30 a.m. Mass.

FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

A view of the Roman Missal from the priest. Ever since we started using the new ritual for Mass, the General Instructions on the Roman Missal has told us the people should sing the dialogues and acclamation. Previous editions, however, put the musical notations in the back of the book in an appendix. The current edition has integrated the music in the main body of the book. Now, when I open the book at the start of Mass, I see first of all the musical notation for the sign of the cross. I have to look below it for the sign of the cross without musical notation.

This quickly tells me that the liturgy means to encourage us, if not command us, to make the dialogues and acclamations sung. What, we should sing everything when I cannot sing? How can this happen? Every time we speak, we speak on a musical note. We inflect our voice and move from one note to another in ordinary speech as a matter of course. Singing only means enhancing the speaking note. Singing means intentionally heightening the spoken word. The elevated nature of singing can raise our minds and hearts more to the Lord or to whatever we want to honor.

The arrangement of the text for Sundays puts all the prayers of the day on one page instead of two. This mean that I have to remember which Sunday's prayers I have to use at the celebration.

LITURGY AND PROVERBS

Proverbs provides a counterpoint to the parable of the servants and the talents. The gospel praises the industrious servants, but Proverbs praises the worthy wife. The passage comes from the last chapter of Proverbs. The author wrote it as an acrostic in twenty-two verses running through the twenty-two letters of the Hebrew alphabet.

The author probes the nature of wisdom. He honors Solomon by dedicating the work to him. He does this by saying that Solomon wrote it. He wrote it in the late sixth century before Christ.

Even in a patriarchal society, women could run a household and engage in commerce. The woman in Proverbs outshines the resourcefulness of the men on the gospel story. She puts a feminine face on wisdom and shares in the joy of her husband.
