FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

Do we have a new Mass? No, we have the same Mass we have always had. At times in our history, we have changed some rituals. We did this after the Second Vatican Council. We have changed languages at times, as we did when we went from Greek to Latin about 1700 years ago. We shall change our English translation November 26. We shall not change the text, but the translation of the text.

Why do we have to change? We change because living things grow, reach adulthood and then fade. Our language has changed. We change our translation to keep up with change. We also change our translation because many peoples who do not speak an Indo-European language depend on our English as a basis for translating from Latin. English has turned into the people's Latin for many cultures and peoples. We also change to keep in touch with other Indo-European languages, which for the most part have kept the longer sentences of the original Latin although we opted to translate forty years ago into smaller sentences. Now we have translated into the larger sentences of the Latin, the larger sentences that even the Spanish, Portuguese and French have understood for decades.

LITURGY AND EZEKIEL

The prophet Ezekiel announces that God himself will one day shepherd his people Israel. God will tend to his sheep. God will heal them and bind their wounds. God will judge between sheep and sheep, between goat and ram. The Lord God will serve as shepherd.

In the Gospel, the Son of Man will sit as king over all creation. He will do the shepherd's work of separating sheep and goats, one from another. Like the Lord God in the prophet Ezekiel, the Son of Man will sit in judgment over creation.

PARENTS, YOUTH AND HPV

The medical profession wants to vaccinate both pre-teen girls and pre-teen boys with a vaccination against the human papillomavirus (HPV). Most people contract the virus through sexual contacts. If we support this vaccination, does it mean that we expect them not to live chaste and pure lives? If we object, does it teach our children the value we put on chastity and virginity? How can we work together to instill the values of chastity, virginity and purity in our children?
