LITURGY: NUMBERS

Our first reading next Sunday comes from the book of Numbers. It gives us the blessing Aaron would have used in blessing the people. It asks God to bless them, to let his face shine upon them and to give them peace. How does this fit with the celebration of Mary the Mother of God?

The feast we celebrate January 1 has had several names. At one time, we called it the Octave of Christmas. At another time, we celebrated the circumcision of the Child Jesus. Now we celebrate it as the feast honoring Mary as Mother of God. In recent years, the day has also taken on the aspects of a world day of prayer for peace. Perhaps in this last context the reading from Numbers makes sense.

On the other hand, in the birth of the Lord Jesus, the Word and Son of God, God has smiled on us with a smile only a human one can give. From the birth, we know God as compassion and love. In this context, the reading can make even more sense.

MEXICO AND OUR PARISHES

We have had Bishop Carmona and Father Jaime Rojas from the diocese of Puerto Escondido in Oaxaca Mexico visit us in the past. Puerto Escondido (Hidden Port) is located in the southwest corner of Mexico along the Pacific Ocean. It has started to have the extremes of wealth and poverty.

Fr Dave and Jane Pierron have visited a few of the parishes in the diocese. We will go back again from March 2 through March 9. We want to form a longer-term relationship with the diocese, a relationship where we can learn from each other and share resources with one another. The two areas of catechesis and liturgy are immediate needs. What can they learn from us, and what can we learn from them? We know that we cannot do this alone and would like others from our parishes or nearby parishes to be involved as well. Do you have a skill or resource you can share? Do you want to learn from others? Can you speak some Spanish? Time has started to run out for the trip.
