THE SCRUTINIES

On the second, third and fourth Sundays of Lent, those preparing for baptism participate in ritual prayers called scrutinies. The scrutinizes are celebrated in order [1]to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, [2]to protect them against temptation, and [3] to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. (RCIA 141). There are three so that the Elect are gradually instructed about the mystery of sin as they progress in their perception of sin and their desire for salvation. It is a reminder that God is the one who invites us to turn away from those things that keep us from a full and free life in Christ. Each of the three gospels lead to an understanding of the redeeming Christ as living water, light of the world and resurrection and life. We, as an assembly, participate in this ritual prayer of the Church as we join the unbaptized in this time of soul searching to uncover the sin and evil in our hearts and to bring out all that is good and strong in us. This is an essential part of their preparation for baptism and we cannot omit them.

We shall do the scrutinies this year at the 9:30 Mass at Holy Family the next three Sundays. For the scrutinies, we use the readings from Cycle A (Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 and John 4:5-42 [March 11]; 1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a; Psalm 23; Ephesians 5:8-14; John 9:1-41 [March 18]; Ezekiel 37:12-14; Psalm 130; Romans 8:8-11; John 11:1-45 [March 25]).

FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

I feel comfortable leaving you for a week. I leave you in competent hands. We have a busy schedule in Puerto Escondido but we shall have time for prayer..

I cannot play the Archbishop's homily for you this year, but I can enclose it with the bulletin. Please read it and the literature he will send you this week. I have already made my contributions for the parish. I invite you to do the same.

LENT: EXODUS

In Cycle A, which we always use for the Mass with the scrutinies, the Hebrew people complain against Moses hat they have no water to drink. In the Gospel, Jesus experiences thirst and asks for water. The woman, on the other hand thirsts without knowing it and receives living water. This gives some interesting parallels between the two readings. We use Cycle A at Holy Family next week.

In Cycle B, which we shall use at St Denis, the reading from Exodus presents the giving of the Ten Commandments. These commandments direct our response, first to God and parents, then to our peers. As a counterpoint, Jesus accuses the moneychangers of breaking the commandments referring to God by turning the temple into a marketplace. This can lead us to reflect on how we break the commandments by turning something good into profane use.
