#### THE SCRUTINIES

On the second, third and fourth Sundays of Lent, those preparing for baptism participate in ritual prayers called scrutinies. The scrutinizes are celebrated in order [1]to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, [2]to protect them against temptation, and [3]to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. (RCIA 141). There are three so that the Elect are gradually instructed about the mystery of sin as they progress in their perception of sin and their desire for salvation. It is a reminder that God is the one who invites us to turn away from those things that keep us from a full and free life in Christ. Each of the three gospels lead to an understanding of the redeeming Christ as living water, light of the world and resurrection and life. We, as an assembly, participate in this ritual prayer of the Church as we join the unbaptized in this time of soul searching to uncover the sin and evil in our hearts and to bring out all that is good and strong in us. This is an essential part of their preparation for baptism and we cannot omit them.

We shall do the scrutinies this year at the 9:30 Mass at Holy Family the next three Sundays. For the scrutinies, we use the readings from Cycle A (Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 and John 4:5-42 [March 11]; 1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a; Psalm 23; Ephesians 5:8-14; John 9:1-41 [March 18]; Ezekiel 27:12 14: Psalm 120: Psalma 9:9 11: Laber 11:1 45 [March 25])

#### FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

On Saturday, we met with Bishop Carmona. Sunday, we visit the seminary. On Monday, we meet with the religious sisters and the Office of Migrants. On Wednesday, we met with all the bishops of the ecclesiastical province of Oaxaca. We had a big agenda. On Thursday, we visited the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. On Friday, we returned home.

As you keep the Catholic Ministries Appeal and the needs of Food for the Poor in your prayers, keep also the Lord's work in Puerto Escondido and our parishes in your prayers.

#### LENT: CHRONICLES AND SAMUEL

In Cycle B, the book of Chronicles ends with a scathing recap of the history of Israel under its kings and then looks to Cyrus, King of Persia, who let the Israelites return from exile. Chronicles sees that the exile came because of the sins of the people and that the return from exile came from God's forgiveness. God sent a pagan king to change the darkness of defeat and exile into the light of return. We reflect on this reading as we ponder Christ as the light of the world.

In Cycle A, which we use at Holy family, God sends Samuel to anoint a son of Jesse king. God chooses the youngest, David, even though both Jesse and Samuel had their eye on someone else. Samuel needed insight to see what God saw. Only insight from God enabled Samuel to see the one God had chosen. The man born blind received insight so that he could see the One God had anointed in Jesus.


