FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

The girls and boys of the first grade grow into the young women and men of high school. I see the goodness in the elementary school child. I also see that goodness, more mature, in the teenager. I have seen the goodness and the openness to God of those preparing to receive confirmation. Like all of us, they struggle against sin in their lives and long for the freedom from sin that comes from God in the Church. I hope you see their goodness also. Thank you, ninth graders, for your witness to Christ in your lives.

EASTER: THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

What goods thing happened to the cripple? Peter and John had gone to the temple for the 3:00 hour of prayer. They had met a man crippled from birth and, in the name of Jesus the Nazarene, they had healed him. This gave Peter the opportunity to proclaim the resurrection of the Lord Jesus to the people, which caught the attention of the Sadducees and temple police. At the hearing before them, Peter again proclaimed the resurrection. After their release, Peter and John returned to their community. When they had related what had happened the community responded in prayer of praise and petition to God. They asked for the strength to proclaim the word of God in all boldness service, not for freedom from persecution.

The passage for next Sunday comes from peter's speech to the leaders of the people.


